2. GENERAL CLAUSES

The conditions for enrolment, examination and Award are as follows:

- 1. The student will enrol both at SCU and at the Collaborating Institution(s), and the enrolment will be subject to the Funding Arrangements set out in this agreement.
- 2. The student will work under the direction and responsibility of a Supervisory Panel co-chaired by the Principal Supervisor in each of the SCU and the Collaborating Institution(s). Additional members to the Supervisory Panel may also be appointed by the SCU and the Collaborating Institution(s).
- 3. Where an appropriate Principal Supervisor becomes no longer available at SCU, and an appropriate alternative Principal Supervisor at SCU cannot be found, the student's enrolment at SCU will be discontinued and SCU will give Notice that this Agreement is terminated, with no affect upon continuing enrolment and candidature for an Award at the Collaborating Institution.
- 4. The legislation and policies of SCU and the Collaborating Institution(s) will apply to the student unless otherwise stated in this agreement.
- 5. Ethics clearances and requirements will be satisfied as necessary at both institutions.
- 6. The length of time for the Candidature will be shared between the SCU and the Collaborating Institution(s) with a minimum of one third of the Candidature or 12 months (whichever is greater) to be undertaken at SCU.
- 7. Intellectual Property and Copyright arrangements will be as agreed between the Parties and detailed in this agreement.
- 8. Unless otherwise specified in this agreement, Copyright in the thesis produced by the student will vest in the student.

9.	Publication arrangements will be as detailed in this agreement.
10.	Upon successful completion of the Candidature, SCU and the Collaborating Institution(s) will award the Student the Award set out in this agreement.
11.	The Award certificates/testamurs/academic transcripts must state that the Award was undertaken as a consequence of a cotutelle/joint enrolment recognizing the name of the other university.
12.	The student will be responsible for arranging health and travel insurance in both countries prior to the commencement of their studies. The student will also need to meet the visa requirements applicable in each country.
13.	The Term of this Agreement is until the student enrolled in the cotutelle/joint degree has completed the program or as otherwise agreed by Notice signed by all parties.
14.	The Agreement may be terminated on thirty (30) days written Notice from SCU in accordance with Clause 4.
