

What is HEA Fellowship?

- Fellowship is an internationally recognised badge of professional success for those who teach and support learning in higher education.
- Fellowship provides individuals with recognition of their practice, impact and leadership in teaching and learning.
- Fellowship is awarded to applicants who can demonstrate their teaching practice conforms to the Professional Standards Framework, PSF 2023.
- The different categories of HEA Fellowship Associate Fellow, Fellow, Senior Fellow and Principal Fellow – recognise the different roles that contribute to teaching and learning in HE.

HEA Fellowship aligns with SCU's 'Outstanding people' strategic priority. As of 1 August 2024, SCU has Access Membership with Advance HE.

Benefits of HEA Fellowship

The advantages of HEA Fellowship include:

- International recognition of expertise.
- Enhanced career prospects.
- Opportunities for reflective practice and professional growth through Global Member Projects.
- Access to a global network (Advance HE Connect) of HE professionals.
- Access to Global Impact grants.
- Mentoring and collegial support.
- Promotes interdisciplinary research.
- Recognition of an individual's commitment to high-quality teaching and learning, with the entitlement to use post-nominal letters (AFHEA, FHEA, SFHEA or PFHEA).





Eligibility for HEA Fellowship in Australia and New Zealand

To be eligible to apply for HEA Fellowship, individuals must evidence their teaching and learning practice in higher education, which is currently defined as:

- level 5 or above of the Australian Qualifications Framework (AQF);
- level 5 or above of the New Zealand Qualification Framework (NZQF);
- other equivalent higher education frameworks;
- activity focused on supporting students within a Higher Education context, providing the student(s) are enrolled on a Higher Education Qualification (see standards listed above), may also be considered as evidence equivalent to the higher education frameworks;
- delivery of non-accredited continuing professional development for academic and learning support staff may also be considered as evidence equivalent to the higher education academic frameworks.





Eligibility for HEA Fellowship in Australia and New Zealand (contd)

From September 2018 onwards, the definition of Higher Education for the purpose of the HEA Fellowship is extended to also include:

- Foundation or Enabling Programs
- English for Academic Purposes Programs
- Continuing Professional Development Programs (CPD), where the CPD is designed to update and extend knowledge for professionals operating in graduate roles;
- Partnership working with communities, where the development uses structured frameworks informed by a scholarly evidence-base;
- Industry or Profession based applicants supporting Higher Education students on placements, internships or in Work-Integrated-Learning activities.

HEA Fellowship is for everyone who support teaching and learning in higher education, not just academics. This includes support staff, librarians, learning technologists, educational designers, research supervisors, clinical teaching staff...







D3 is suitable for individuals whose comprehensive understanding and effective practice provides a basis from which they lead or influence those who teach and/or support high-quality learning. Individuals are able to evidence a sustained record of **leading or influencing the practice** of those who teach and/or support high quality learning.




